

Sunrise Elementary PBS Lesson Plan

Skill: Being responsible, having integrity, being safe, and being enthusiastic.

Setting: Cafeteria (Middle School)

Read Aloud to Students:

Today we are going to discuss the procedures of the cafeteria.

- Face forward in line
- Clean up after yourself
- Stay in your own space
- Use appropriate voice levels
- Raise hand for help
- Remain in seat
- Handle and eat only your food
- Use manners

Teacher Models for Students: (requires two teachers)

Example: Teacher lines up, facing forward and talks with appropriate voice levels. Teacher proceeds through line picking up milk and tray. If a regular tray is chosen, teacher stops at computer desk and enters pin number. If a salad is chosen, proceed to salad bar and pick up the appropriate number of toppings then return to computer to enter pin number. Teacher picks up fork/spoon, napkins, and condiments. Teacher proceeds to the table of their choice. Teacher remains in his/her seat, uses appropriate voice levels, handles only their food, and uses appropriate manners. Teacher returns their tray once a cafeteria worker is present at the window. Teacher returns to his/her table and waits to be dismissed back to class.

Nonexample: Teacher stands in front of line shouting to a teacher friend at the rear of the line. One teacher proceeds through the line without getting a milk or putting in their pin number. The other teacher gets a salad, picks too many toppings, and does not enter their pin number. Once seated, the teachers talk extremely loud to other at their table. Teachers share their food with each other. One teacher returns their tray to the window with trash on it while the other teacher leaves their salad bowl on the table. They both proceed to classrooms without being dismissed.

Example: Teacher models all appropriate steps to using the cafeteria.

Student Role Play: Students model all appropriate steps to using the cafeteria with teacher feedback.

After the Lesson: After returning to the classroom, allow time to discuss further and answer questions. If any problems arise, re-teach the lesson or seek additional resources.
